

Prayer at the Table: Christmas

The bread and wine we're about to share joins us to the people throughout history and across the world who have come to this meal in search of life.

Just as Jesus' birth was for the whole world this bread and wine is for everyone, for the hungry, for the lost, for those who search and those who are found; for those who question and those who know peace this is bread and wine for everyone.

Let us pray

Holy God, we praise you. Let the heavens be joyful, and the earth be glad. We bless you for creating the whole world, for your promises to your people, and for the life we know in Jesus Christ your son. Born of Mary, he shares our life. Eating with sinners, he welcomes us. Leading his followers, he guides us. Dying on the cross, he loves us. Risen from the dead, he gives new life.

On the night before Jesus died, he had supper with his friends. He took bread, thanked you, as we have thanked you, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, saying: this is my body, given for you. Each time you do this, remember me. After supper he took the wine, thanked you for it, and passed it to his friends, saying: This cup is the new promise God has made with you in my blood. Each time you do this, remember me.

We pray, God of love, that you will send your Holy Spirit upon us and what we do here: that we and these signs, touched by your Spirit, may be signs of life and love to each other and to all the world. Amen.

You are our life; You are our hope; You are our peace; And we praise you.

In communion we join ourselves to all your people and we pray:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed it be your name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

The bread which we break is an offering of life to us all. The cup which we take is a celebration of love for us all. The gifts of God for the people of God.

Lamb of God, you find us in our lostness, **lift us up**. Lamb of God, you lead us to your fold, **hold us close**. Lamb of God, you conquer all injustice, **we cry for peace**.

SHARING THE ELEMENTS:

We thank you, God of compassion, that you have nourished us with the bread of life and the wine of hope.

As in Christ your love flowed out to those around him, so let your love flow through us to others.

As in Christ your life was broken, so let your life meet us in our brokenness and release hope in us and others, through Jesus our hope and our life.
