Fairview Heights Area Food Pantry 2019 Summary

The St. John UCC congregation did a remarkable job of supporting the Fairview Heights Area Food Pantry during 2019. Food items and money were donated each Sunday communion was served. Pennies for Missions were designated for the pantry during several months. The ladies of Evening

Circle made monetary donations to the pantry on multiple occasions. Over 1,252 food items and more than \$3100.00 were delivered to the pantry after communion. Other food items and cash donations were sent directly to the Pantry by St. John members. The cash donations were used to purchase milk, margarine, eggs, bread, ground beef, and other items needed but not met by donations such as detergent, pancake mix and personal care items.

The pantry served more than 1252 families (4021 people) in 2019. There were 110 new families that sought food assistance. The number of Fairview Heights residents in food crisis continues. The Fairview Heights Food Pantry serves residents of Fairview Heights. Clients must bring a photo ID and a piece of mail such as a utility bill to prove residence. A client may obtain food once a month. Emergency orders are provided for non-residents who are referred to the pantry. Thank you all for helping meet the needs of others. May our giving spirt continue during 2020.
