President Sue Williams called the meeting to order at 11:00. 18 members were present The minutes of the January 23, 2022 Annual Meeting, the June 12, 2022 Semi Annual Meeting and the July 17, 2022 special meeting were reviewed. Nancy Eisenhauer made a motion to accept the minutes and the motion was seconded by Dorothy Ovelgoenner. Motion passed unanimously. Ginny Ganschinietz reviewed the financial report for 2022. Plumbing repairs, new furnace & A/C, tree removal and lawn mower were the major expenses. Donations in December helped us financially. Expenses exceeded income by \$180 which was better than expected. Ginny's volunteer services in the office have helped us financially. Jim Eisenhauer and Sharon Banjavcic audited the books and found everything in order. Jim Eisenhauer made a motion to accept the report and the motion was seconded by Sue Ganschinietz.

Ginny Ganschinietz presented the 2023 budget. The budget is similar to the 2022 budget and the staff received a %5 increase per the Illinois South guidelines. Expenses are projected to exceed income by \$17,289. Nancy Eisenhauer moved to accept the budget and Sharon Banjavcic seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

We have 3 members leaving the Council this year - Becky Riess, Chuck Kistler & Tom Miller. Nancy Eisenhauer, Jan Miller and Russ Hartmann have agreed to a 2-year term on the 2023-2024 Council. Eric Moayer moved to accept the new slate of Council members and Ginny Ganschinietz seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Jim Eisenhauer moved to adjourned the meeting and Chuck Kistler seconded. The motions passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 11:10.

2023 FOOD PANTRY RECAP

Fairview Heights Area Food Pantry saw a big increase in Fairview Heights' residents in need of food assistance in 2023. The pantry served 1278 households (3770 people). There were 127 new families who sought help meeting their food needs. The pantry also serves emergency food to homeless people and non-residents who are referred to the pantry.

St. John UCC did an incredible job of supporting the pantry. The congregation brought more than 850 food items and more than \$1500 which were placed on the altar on Communion Sunday services. Noisy Offerings were collected. Evening Circle made cash donations. Other members of the congregation made donations directly to the pantry. The number of Fairview Heights' residents in food crisis continues.
