SERMON: **“It’s All About Love”**



I have good news and bad news today. I’ll start with the bad news. The “temple police” are at it again, interrogating Jesus. They’ve tried Pharisees and Sadducees and now they are trying, what some translations

call, a “lawyer”. In those days, lawyers were not what we think as attorneys. They were more like professors, experts in the law of Moses.

The good news is that, once again, Jesus answers with great wisdom and the interrogators are left speechless.

The bad news is that it didn’t seem to matter if Jesus had the right or wrong answer. The temple authorities feel threatened by Jesus and plan to execute him no matter what, and Jesus knows it.

How frustrating that must have been for Jesus? However, Jesus is not like us. I doubt if he felt frustrated in this situation. God sent him on this

journey to open the hearts and minds of all he encountered. I think Jesus knew the risks for his personal safety and he obeyed God anyway.

Let’s think about that for a minute. How many of us would do the same? Maybe some people who have professions that demand personal sacrifice, such as fire fighters, policemen, EMT’s, front-line Covid workers, doctors and nurses may make such a sacrifice. Yet I doubt they spend too much time thinking about the fact that they might die as they serve others.

Jesus knew he would face the cross, even as he shared the good news of the gospel with us. And the best news came three days later when he rose in victory. Because Jesus loved the Holy One that sent him and because he loved all of us as God’s beloved children, he obeyed God. It was all about love and for the love of all.



Praise be to the one who continues to send us good news even in the midst of bad. Amen.
