

***RESPONSIVE CALL TO WORSHIP: Psalm 146 1-10**
Praise the Lord! Let my whole being praise the Lord!
I will praise the Lord with all my life;
I will sing praises to my God as long as I live.
Don't trust leaders; don't trust any human beings –
There's no saving help with them!
Their breath leaves them,
then they go back to the ground.

EPISTLE READING: Hebrews 9:11-14

*(The description of Jesus as better than a high priest
continues.)*

¹¹ But Christ has appeared as the high priest of the
good things that have happened. He passed through
the greater and more perfect meeting tent, which
isn't made by human hands (that is, it's not a part of
this world). ¹² He entered the holy of holies once for
all by his own blood, not by the blood of goats or
calves, securing our deliverance for all time. ¹³ If the
blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkled ashes of

cows made spiritually contaminated people holy and
clean, ¹⁴ how much more will the blood of Jesus wash
our consciences clean from dead works in order to
serve the living God? He offered himself to God
through the eternal Spirit as a sacrifice without any
flaw.

***READING OF THE GOSPEL LESSON:**

Mark 12:28-34

²⁸ One of the legal experts heard their dispute and
saw how well Jesus answered them. He came over
and asked him, "Which commandment is the most
important of all?"

²⁹ Jesus replied, "The most important one is Israel,
listen! Our God is the one Lord, ³⁰ and you must love
the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your
being, with all your mind, and with all your
strength. ³¹ The second is this, You will love your
neighbor as yourself. No other commandment is
greater than these."

³² The legal expert said to him, "Well said, Teacher.
You have truthfully said that God is one and there is
no other besides him. ³³ And to love God with all of
the heart, a full understanding, and all of one's
strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself is

much more important than all kinds of entirely burned offerings and sacrifices.”

³⁴ When Jesus saw that he had answered with wisdom, he said to him, “You aren’t far from God’s kingdom.” After that, no one dared to ask him any more question.

These are God’s words revealed to us today.

MESSAGE: “Practices of Faith”

No love was lost between the expert in the law and the Sadducees. The profession of the scribes was to interpret the law in all its many rules and regulations. Their trade was to know and to apply the oral law, while the Sadducees did not accept the oral law at all.

This scribe came to Jesus with a question which was often a matter of debate in the Rabbinic schools. In Judaism there was a kind of double tendency. There was the tendency to expand the law limitlessly into hundreds and thousands of rules and regulations, none of which anyone could obey. But there was also the tendency to try to gather up the law into one sentence, one general statement which would be a compilation of its whole message; easier to

understand and easier to obey. Sort of like a 2-minute elevator speech.

The expert who asked Jesus this question was asking about something which was a living issue in Jewish thought and discussion. For an answer Jesus took two great commandments and put them together.

- (1) “Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone.” That single sentence is the real creed of Judaism (Deuteronomy 6:4). It had three uses. It is called *the Shema*.
- (2) It was the sentence with which the service of the synagogue always began and still begins. The full Shema is Deuteronomy 6:4-9; Numbers 15:37-41. It is the declaration that God is the only God, the foundation of Jewish monotheism.
- (3) The three passages of the Shema were contained in the *phylacteries*, little boxes which devote Jews wore on their foreheads and on their wrists when they were at prayer. As they prayed they reminded themselves of their creed.
- (4) The Shema was contained in a little cylindrical box call the *Mezuzah*, which was and still is affixed to the door of every Jewish house to

remind Jewish families of God as they went out and as they came in.

When Jesus quoted this sentence as the first commandment, every devout Jew would agree with him. Jesus added “You shall love your neighbor as yourself” from Leviticus 19:18. This sentence originally meant your Jewish neighbors. But Jesus quoted it without qualifications and without limiting boundaries. He took an old law and filled it with new meaning. The scribe willingly accepted this, and went on to say that such a love was better than all sacrifices.

I mentioning all of this information to give you a better understanding of Jewish customs and a better understanding of Jesus. Jesus adds that it is always easy to let ritual take the place of love.

Declaring that they worship only one God was a way to show their religion to the world who worshipped many Gods. Others could tell who the Jews were and weren't.

We have often song “they will know we are Christians by our love.” Are there any other ways others can tell we are Christians?

PASTORAL PRAYER: Beginning with a time for silent personal prayer.

Our one and only God, we worship you because of your power and your compassion. Your love is mighty and you want us to never forget this love. As we follow that love and show it to our neighbors, help us when we stumble. Help us when we judge others. Help us when we decide who is worthy of our love. Help us love all your people unconditionally.

One way we can demonstrate this love is by praying for those on our prayer list and helping them in anyway we can. We can send a card, make a phone call, often to shop for them, take over a casserole. Being a Christian is not just about going to church, it's about love for God and for others.

We pray all these things in the name of your Son . .

THE LORD'S PRAYER: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed it be your name. Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts as, we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.
