#### SCRIPTURE LESSONS: Acts 1:1-11 The risen Jesus with his disciples

1 Theophilus, the first scroll I wrote concerned everything Jesus did and taught from the beginning, <sup>2</sup>right up to the day when he was taken up into heaven. Before he was taken up, working in the power of the Holy Spirit, Jesus instructed the apostles he had chosen. <sup>3</sup> After his suffering, he showed them that he was alive with many convincing proofs. He appeared to them over a period of forty days, speaking to them about God's kingdom. <sup>4</sup> While they were eating together, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem but to wait for what the Father had promised. He said, "This is what you heard from me: <sup>5</sup> John baptized with water, but in only a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." <sup>6</sup> As a result, those who had gathered together asked Jesus, "Lord, are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel now?"

<sup>7</sup> Jesus replied, "It isn't for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has set by his own authority. <sup>8</sup> Rather, you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

<sup>9</sup> After Jesus said these things, as they were watching, he was lifted up and a cloud took him out of their sight. <sup>10</sup> While he was going away and as they were staring toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood next to them. <sup>11</sup> They said, "Galileans, why are you standing here, looking toward heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way that you saw him go into heaven."

## EPISTLE READING: Ephesians 1:15-23 Paul's prayer for the Ephesians

<sup>15</sup> Since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all God's people, this is the reason that <sup>16</sup> I don't stop giving thanks to God for you when I remember you in my prayers. <sup>17</sup> I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, will give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation that makes God known to you. <sup>18</sup> I pray that the eyes of your heart will have enough light to see what is the hope of God's call, what is the richness of God's glorious inheritance among believers, <sup>19</sup> and what is the overwhelming greatness of God's power that is working among us believers. This power is conferred by the energy of God's powerful strength. <sup>20</sup> God's power was at work in Christ when God raised him from the dead and sat him at God's right side in the heavens, <sup>21</sup> far above every ruler and authority and power and angelic power, any power that might be named not only now but in the future. <sup>22</sup> God put everything under Christ's feet and made him head of everything in the church, <sup>23</sup> which is his body. His body, the church, is the fullness of Christ, who fills everything in every way.

#### \*GOSPEL LESSON: Luke 24:44-53

<sup>44</sup> Jesus said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the Law from Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms must be fulfilled." <sup>45</sup> Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures. <sup>46</sup> He said to them, "This is what is written: the Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, <sup>47</sup> and a change of heart and life for the forgiveness of sins must be preached in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. <sup>48</sup> You are witnesses of these things. <sup>49</sup> Look, I'm sending to you what my Father promised, but you are to stay in the city until you have been furnished with heavenly power." Ascension of Jesus

<sup>50</sup> He led them out as far as Bethany, where he lifted his hands and blessed them. <sup>51</sup> As he blessed them, he left them and was taken up to heaven. <sup>52</sup> They worshipped him and returned to Jerusalem overwhelmed with joy. <sup>53</sup> And they were continuously in the temple praising God.

## These are the ancient words revealed to us anew. Thanks be to God. Amen

#### **MESSAGE: "Being Transformed"**

After all Jesus had done, plus the Transfiguration, healings, teachings, crucifixion, resurrection, and appearing to the disciples, the end of his ministry is described in one sentence; "he blessed them and was taken up to be with his Father." It seems a little anticlimatic to me. I mean, where's the brass band, or angels singing the Hallelujah Chorus? Jesus did not go "out with a bang", as they say.

I was most impressed by the Disciples. They seemed changed. When Jesus first called them was when we first met them. They seemed like excited but clumsy school boys. "But we fished over there all night and caught no fish. Why should we try again as you said, Jesus?" "You want **us** to feed all these people?" "You want us to love our enemies?" "You want a tax collector to join us?" "We want to sit at your eft and right when you come into your glory." "Jesus, are you going to let this storm kill us?" "Jesus, I want to walk on water like you do." "No, Jesus, we will not let you be arrested and killed. That won't happen!"

You can probably think of a few more times the Disciples didn't understand Jesus and stumbled. But look

at this passage I read. <sup>52</sup> They worshipped him and returned to Jerusalem overwhelmed with joy. <sup>53</sup> And they were continuously in the temple praising God.

I expected them to cry or tell Jesus not to leave them. Something had changed in the disciples. After following Jesus the past three years or so, listening to him, watching him, seeing how he comforts the people, they seem to understand who he truly is. They are no longer afraid. They are confident. They are joyous. They have been transformed by this man, Jesus.

You and I have followed Jesus more than three years, I think it is safe to say. As we hear and read the scriptures, sing praises to him, spend time in prayer, donate to missions, bring food for the food pantry, call shut-ins, send greeting cards, and more, I believe we are being transformed every day just like the Disciples. We are no longer afraid. We are confident. And we are joyous. Jesus has touched so many people, not just the disciples and us, but many, many, many more. We may wish we could see him in the flesh right before us, yet we know his presence is always with us.

Have we been transformed by this man? Try to count how many ways. Amen
