

⁴The Lord God gave me an educated tongue to know how to respond to the weary with a word that will awaken them in the morning. [a]

God awakens my ear in the morning to listen, as educated people do.

⁵The Lord God opened my ear; I didn't rebel; I didn't turn my back.

⁶ Instead, I gave my body to attackers, and my cheeks to beard pluckers.

I didn't hide my face from insults and spitting.

⁷The Lord God will help me; therefore, I haven't been insulted.

Therefore, I set my face like flint, and knew I wouldn't be ashamed.

⁸ The one who will declare me innocent is near.

SECOND TESTAMENT LESSON: James 3:1-12 TAMING THE TONGUE

3 My brothers and sisters, not many of you should become teachers, because we know that we teachers will be judged more strictly. ² We all make mistakes often, but those who don't make mistakes with their words have reached full maturity. Like a bridled horse, they can control themselves entirely. ³ When we bridle horses and put bits in their mouths to lead them wherever we want, we can control their whole bodies.

⁴ Consider ships: They are so large that strong winds are needed to drive them. But pilots direct their ships wherever they want with a little rudder. ⁵ In the same way, even though the tongue is a small part of the body, it boasts wildly.

Think about this: A small flame can set a whole forest on fire. ⁶ The tongue is a small flame of fire, a world of evil at work in us. It contaminates our entire lives. Because of it, the circle of life is set on fire. The tongue itself is set on fire by the flames of hell.

⁷ People can tame and already have tamed every kind of animal, bird, reptile, and fish. ⁸ No one can tame the tongue, though. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹ With it we both bless the Lord and Father and curse human beings made in God's likeness. ¹⁰ Blessing and cursing come from the same mouth. My brothers and sisters, it just shouldn't be this way!

¹¹ Both fresh water and salt water don't come from the same spring, do they? ¹² My brothers and sisters, can a fig tree produce olives? Can a grapevine produce figs? Of course not, and fresh water doesn't flow from a saltwater spring either.

*GOSPEL READING: Mark 27-38 JESUS PREDICTS HIS DEATH

²⁷ Jesus and his disciples went into the villages near Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?"

²⁸ They told him, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, and still others one of the prophets."

²⁹ He asked them, "And what about you? Who do you say that I am?"

Peter answered, "You are the Christ." ³⁰ Jesus ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

³¹ Then Jesus began to teach his disciples: "The Human One must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and the legal experts, and

be killed, and then, after three days, rise from the dead." 32 He said this plainly. But Peter took hold of Jesus and, scolding him, began to correct him. ³³ Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, then sternly corrected Peter: "Get behind me, Satan. You are not thinking God's thoughts but human thoughts." ³⁴ After calling the crowd together with his disciples, Jesus said to them, "All who want to come after me must say no to themselves, take up their cross, and follow me. 35 All who want to save their lives will lose them. But all who lose their lives because of me and because of the good news will save them. ³⁶ Why would people gain the whole world but lose their lives? ³⁷ What will people give in exchange for their lives? 38 Whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this unfaithful and sinful generation, the Human One will be ashamed of that person when he comes in the Father's glory with the holy angels."

These are the ancient words revealed to us anew.

MESSAGE: "Now that we know who he is, he is leaving us?"

Months ago, when we read about Jesus visiting his hometown, his neighbors and family wondered who he was. Who he had become? Every Sunday since, we have had the same question? Who is this man?

In today's passage, Jesus asks the same question. Who do you say that I am? The disciples have been with him for awhile so their answer should be based on what they have seen, heard, and experienced.

This Gospel passage that I read this morning is actually a turning point in the whole Gospel of Mark, in that Jesus introduces his coming passion to his disciples and begins to move toward Jerusalem. This passage is the beginning of a much larger unit which ends in Chapter 10:45. It is bracketed by two stories of healing the blind; one in 8:22-26 and the other in chapter 10:46-52. The governing theme is Jesus' predictions of his passion and the disciples' total inability to understand or to accept what Jesus said.

Today's reading consists of three parts; the confession of Peter, Jesus' prediction of his passion, and the instructions to the crowd about discipleship. Al three focus on who Jesus is.

If you took a poll on who people thought Jesus is, they would say Jesus is a forerunner of the messiah. Jesus' announcement of the approaching kingdom and his words and deeds of power have heightened anticipation but have not persuaded the people that he is the fulfillment of that anticipation. They have, as we all have, an image of the coming messiah, but Jesus does not fit it. After all, it is easier to believe that a messiah WILL come than to believe one HAS come. Messiah as future keeps our images intact and

makes no demands; messiah as present calls for an altered image and demands an altered self. LET ME SAY THAT AGAIN. If the Messiah is present, we have to change how we "see" him, "hear" him, and "speak" to him. And then, after all that, IT'S OUR TURN TO CHANGE.

Of course, we have an advantage. We have always known who the messiah is, but have we always agreed or accepted who a MESSIAH is? Do we wish Jesus would do things differently? Do we wish this Messiah would answer our prayers better and faster? Would we want the Messiah to change at all? Is it us who need to change? Amen
