- <sup>10</sup> A competent wife, how does one find her? Her value is far above pearls.
- <sup>11</sup> Her husband entrusts his heart to her,

- and with her he will have all he needs.
- <sup>12</sup> She brings him good and not trouble all the days of her life.
- <sup>13</sup> She seeks out wool and flax; she works joyfully with her hands.
- <sup>14</sup> She is like a fleet of merchant ships, bringing food from a distance.
- <sup>15</sup> She gets up while it is still night, providing food for her household, even some for her female servants.
- <sup>16</sup> She surveys a field and acquires it; from her own resources, she plants a vineyard.

# SECOND TESTAMENT: James 3:13-4:3, 7-8A Wisdom from above

<sup>13</sup> Are any of you wise and understanding? Show that your actions are good with a humble lifestyle that comes from wisdom. <sup>14</sup> However, if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your heart, then stop bragging and living in ways that deny the truth. <sup>15</sup> This is not the wisdom that comes down from above. Instead, it is from the earth, natural and demonic. <sup>16</sup> Wherever there is jealousy and selfish ambition, there is disorder and everything that is evil. <sup>17</sup> What of the wisdom from above? First, it is pure, and then peaceful, gentle,

obedient, filled with mercy and good actions, fair, and genuine. <sup>18</sup> Those who make peace sow the seeds of justice by their peaceful acts.

## **Conflict with people and God**

4 What is the source of conflict among you? What is the source of your disputes? Don't they come from your cravings that are at war in your own lives? <sup>2</sup> You long for something you don't have, so you commit murder. You are jealous for something you can't get, so you struggle and fight. You don't have because you don't ask. <sup>3</sup> You ask and don't have because you ask with evil intentions, to waste it on your own cravings.

<sup>7</sup> Therefore, submit to God. Resist the devil, and he will run away from you. <sup>8</sup> Come near to God, and he will come near to you. Wash your hands, you sinners. Purify your hearts, you double-minded.

# \*GOSPEL LESSON: Mark 9:30-37 Jesus predicts his death

<sup>30</sup> From there Jesus and his followers went through Galilee, but he didn't want anyone to know it. <sup>31</sup> This was because he was teaching his disciples, "The Human One will be delivered into human hands. They will kill him. Three days after he is killed he will rise up." <sup>32</sup> But they didn't understand this kind of talk, and they were afraid to ask him.

<sup>33</sup> They entered Capernaum. When they had come into a house, he asked them, "What were you arguing about

during the journey?" <sup>34</sup> They didn't respond, since on the way they had been debating with each other about who was the greatest. <sup>35</sup> He sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be least of all and the servant of all." <sup>36</sup> Jesus reached for a little child, placed him among the Twelve, and embraced him. Then he said, <sup>37</sup> "Whoever welcomes one of these children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me isn't actually welcoming me but rather the one who sent me."

These are the ancient words revealed to us anew.

### MESSAGE: Don't get distracted.

I don't know if the author of the Gospel of Mark wants us to feel sorry for the disciples at this point, but quite frankly I do. Earlier in the gospel Jesus said things to them in code, and thy didn't get it. The parables were secret, hidden messages which they gradually learned how to understand but it had to be away from the crowds. When Jesus warned them about the leaven of the Pharisees and Herod (8:15) they thought he was making a comment abut them forgetting to bring bread. They have struggled to get their minds around the fact that he often says things that have a clear meaning at the surface level, but what he wants is for them to look under the surface and find a hidden meaning

somewhere else. It makes me think about the difference between Sunday School and Seminary.

And now Jesus tells them something which we, the readers, realize he means quite literally; and they, not surprisingly, are puzzled because they are looking for a hidden meaning and can't find it. Remember when I told you I couldn't do crossword puzzles. I get as confused as the disciples.

In this passage Jesus is not teaching the crowds. This is part of the hidden, inner meaning of Jesus' whole career, the bit that the crowds won't see until it actually happens. Jesus doesn't, at this stage, even attempt to tell parables about his approaching fate. Nearer the time he will do strange things, and say even stranger things, about it; but at this stage he is simply trying to tell them what he can see is going to happen. He will be handed over; he will be killed; he will rise again.

Why couldn't they understand? Basically, because no such fate could possibly have been part of their game plan, their understanding of what a Messiah might do. (We talked a little about this last week. To the Jews, Jesus did not fit their description of what a Messiah is.) Probably not all Jews of the time believed that God would ever send a Messiah; but nobody at all believed that if and when God did send one, that Messiah would have to suffer, much less have to die.

At this stage we can only sympathize with the disciples; we must ask ourselves whether we do the

same thing. When God is trying to say something to us, how good are we at listening? Is there something in scripture, or something we've heard in church, or something we sense going on around us, through which God is speaking to us. If so, are we open to it? Are we prepared to have our earlier ways of understanding things taken apart so that a new way of understanding can open up instead?

Any time we are trying to learn new things, we must not let our thoughts be distracted. We might be distracted by thoughts of what will be our reward once we decode what Jesus is saying to us.

There are no thrones for us to sit on. Our reward is to kneel before God and say, "Here I am Lord. Send me!"
