SCRIPTURE LESSONS: Exodus 34:29-35 Moses' brightly shining face

²⁹ Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two covenant tablets in his hand, Moses didn't realize that the skin of his face shone brightly because he had been talking with God. 30 When Aaron and all the Israelites saw the skin of Moses' face shining brightly, they were afraid to come near him. ³¹ But Moses called them closer. So Aaron and all the leaders of the community came back to him, and Moses spoke with them. ³² After that, all the Israelites came near as well, and Moses commanded them everything that the Lord had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. 33 When Moses finished speaking with them, he put a veil over his face. 34 Whenever Moses went into the Lord's presence to speak with him, Moses would take the veil off until he came out again. When Moses came out and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, ³⁵ the Israelites would see that the skin of Moses' face was shining brightly. So Moses would put the veil on his face again until the next time he went in to speak with the Lord.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 99 Page 687

EPISTLE LESSON: 2 Corinthians 3:12 – 4:2

¹² So, since we have such a hope, we act with great confidence. ¹³ We aren't like Moses, who used to put a veil over his face so that the Israelites couldn't watch the end of what was fading away. ¹⁴ But their minds were closed.

Right up to the present day the same veil remains when the old covenant is read. The veil is not removed because it is taken away by Christ. ¹⁵ Even today, whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their hearts. ¹⁶ But whenever someone turns back to the Lord, the veil is removed. ¹⁷ The Lord is the Spirit, and where the Lord's Spirit is, there is freedom. ¹⁸ All of us are looking with unveiled faces at the glory of the Lord as if we were looking in a mirror. We are being transformed into that same image from one degree of glory to the next degree of glory. This comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

4 This is why we don't get discouraged, given that we received this ministry in the same way that we received God's mercy. ² Instead, we reject secrecy and shameful actions. We don't use deception, and we don't tamper with God's word. Instead, we commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God by the public announcement of the truth.

*GOSPEL LESSON: Luke 9:28-43a

These are the ancient words revealed to us anew.

Thanks be to God.

Jesus transformed

²⁸ About eight days after Jesus said these things, he took Peter, John, and James, and went up on a mountain to pray. ²⁹ As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed and his clothes flashed white like lightning. ³⁰ Two

men, Moses and Elijah, were talking with him. ³¹ They were clothed with heavenly splendor and spoke about Jesus' departure, which he would achieve in Jerusalem. ³² Peter and those with him were almost overcome by sleep, but they managed to stay awake and saw his glory as well as the two men with him.

³³ As the two men were about to leave Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, it's good that we're here. We should construct three shrines: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah"—but he didn't know what he was saying. ³⁴ Peter was still speaking when a cloud overshadowed them. As they entered the cloud, they were overcome with awe.

³⁵ Then a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, my chosen one. Listen to him!" ³⁶ Even as the voice spoke, Jesus was found alone. They were speechless and at the time told no one what they had seen.

Jesus heals a boy

³⁷ The next day, when Jesus, Peter, John, and James had come down from the mountain, a large crowd met Jesus. ³⁸ A man from the crowd shouted, "Teacher, I beg you to take a look at my son, my only child. ³⁹ Look, a spirit seizes him and, without any warning, he screams. It shakes him and causes him to foam at the mouth. It tortures him and rarely leaves him alone. ⁴⁰ I begged your disciples to throw it out, but they couldn't."

⁴¹ Jesus answered, "You faithless and crooked generation, how long will I be with you and put up with you? Bring your son here." ⁴² While he was coming, the demon threw him down and shook him violently. Jesus spoke harshly to the unclean spirit, healed the child, and gave him back to his father. ⁴³ Everyone was overwhelmed by God's greatness.

MESSAGE: "It all started with prayer"

The season of Epiphany, which began with the visit of the Wise Men, concludes with the Transfiguration of Jesus. That and its companion story the baptism of Jesus in Luke chapter 3, are the foundation for the Christian celebration of the revelation of the Son of God to the world. The story of the Transfiguration is written in Mark, Matthew, and Luke. Both Luke and Matthew locate this story immediately after the confession of Simon Peter and the introduction of the passion into the teaching of Jesus. The word "passion" means a strong and barely controllable emotion: it is also means the suffering and death of Jesus.

Hardly any passage in the Gospels has prompted interpretations as widely divergent as has this one. Many scholars are still arguing over where this took place; Mount Tabor or Mount Herman. However, no matter the answer to some of those types of questions, this particular story of the Transfiguration is Luke's interpretation, and these Lucan accents are important. Instead of "six days"

later" as written in Mark 9, Luke says, "about eight days". Possibly Luke is tying the story to the resurrection, which occurred on the eighth day, the day after the sabbath, or he may be reflecting the use of this account in Christian worship, which was held on the eighth day.

In verse 29 Luke says that this transfiguration event occurred while Jesus was praying. Luke said earlier (verse 18) that Jesus was praying when he asked the questions that led to Peter's confession and the first teaching about his coming death. And even earlier, after Jesus 'baptism, Luke says that it was while Jesus was in prayer that he received the Holy Spirit and the voice of divine approval (3:21-22). The major events and critical moments in the life of Jesus were, according to Luke, marked by prayer.

Let's stop a minute and think about this. It appears
Jesus was a multi-tasker. How could something as
important as the Transfiguration and talking with God not
be as he concentrated on something outside the prayer he
was saying to himself. Do you think this is something we
should learn? What can we learn from this? Are we to be
"in pray" most of the hours we are awake? What would
that look like.? Would more and better blessings come to
us if we prayed continuously? Is it possible to pray too
much or too hard? What is prayer, anyway? Prayer is
talking to God. Are we disturbing hi with our constant
prayers? I don't think so. God is always willing to listen.

He wasn't to hear from each and all of us. Look at what happened when Jesus did that?
