Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Last week was the Thanksgiving Holiday and the health professionals were urging people to stay home and celebrate only with your household. Yet the airports were packed with people who just **HAD** to be with their extended family. Newscasters interviewed some of the travelers and they said things like, "I've never missed Thanksgiving at my mama's. I just have to be there on Thursday."

I was reflecting on my own life and how many times I was **not** home for Christmas or Thanksgiving or New Years' Eve or Easter. Once I graduated from high school and entered nursing school, I was working every holiday. I especially remember my first Thanksgiving in nursing school when I had to take my patient to the morgue. Needless to say, I was doing things my friends back home who went to college and attending parties, never would imagine.

After nursing school, I started working at the hospital as an RN, but as the newbie on the floor, worked all the holidays plus nights, evenings, and weekends. Then I entered the US Navy and served at the Newport Navy Hospital in Newport, Rhode Island. That's about a thousand miles from my parents in Mascoutah. Once again, I never had the opportunity to come home for holidays. I remember one Christmas I was working the night shift but instead of sleeping all day, I had lots of laundry to do. So, I went to the nearest mini-mall laundromat off base. I was there by myself when a very nice police officer came by and said hello. He was walking his beat and checking that I was safe. He was also a newbie as a police officer, working the holidays. We chatted for a while and he actually invited me to his mother's house for supper, but I had to decline since I needed to rest before my next shift. Two years later I was in Pensacola Naval Base with my husband who was stationed there. We didn't get home that holiday either.

The point is that these holidays don't last only one day. Being with family can happen any day of the year when you can be together. And again this year, many of us will follow the advice of the medical experts and stay home. But just as in a laundromat on Christmas, Baby Jesus comes anyway.

I decided to compare the experiences of Mary and Joseph and our experiences this year.

No tinsel, no turkey; no room at the Inn
No parties, no pageants; no bed and no crib
No singing, no caroling; no doctor, no midwife
No visits or seeing grandma; no diapers, no onesies
No bright tree, no gifts underneath;
No baby shower, no water to bath him

Yet knowing it's Christmas, knowing he came
Knowing he was born on this very night
We know God is with us, changing darkness to light
Something is different because of this night
Wherever you are, in church or at home
With no fanfare, no fuss;
A child was born and he came just for us.



Advent Candle Ritual

Making an Advent wreath

Materials: real or artificial evergreen branches, or green garland; five candle holders; four blue candles, or three purple candles and one pink candle; one white candle

- **1.** Form the branches or garland into a circle (symbolizing God's love which never ends).
- 2. Place the four coloured candles in a circle evenly spaced around the wreath.
- 3. Place the white candle (Christ candle) in the middle.

Travelling Nativity

Try setting up your nativity scene in stages this year:

- move the Mary and Joseph figures on a journey through the house until Christmas Eve, when they arrive at the manger
- add angel figures beside the manger on Christmas
- place the baby Jesus figure in the manger on Christmas morning
- add the figures of the shepherds later on Christmas
- keep the nativity scene for the twelve days of
- have the magi figures travel through the house from Christmas Day until the Day of the Epiphany (January 6)
- place the magi figures beside the baby Jesus on the Day of the Epiphany.

Advent surprise gifts

There is a German tradition of secret gift giving during the Advent season, called "christkindl" (Christ child):

- write the name of each member of the family on a slip of paper
- each person chooses a name (without telling who it is) on the first Sunday of Advent
- throughout Advent each person does secret "good deeds" for the person whose name they drew (such as helping with a task without being asked, making a small gift, leaving a note or poem on a pillow or in a pocket
- reveal the names on Christmas Eve or Day and celebrate the gifts each has received.

Make a bookmark to remind you of the Advent Bible stories. Cut out the bookmark, colour it, and glue it to heavier paper.
