Mission Moment

November was the month we collected for Neighbors in Need, a special mission offering of the UCC that supports ministries of justice and compassion in the United States. One-third of the offering supports the Council for American Indian Ministry and the other two-thirds for the Justice and Witness Ministries.

The theme this year for Neighbors in Need is "Mental Health Justice For All!"

A just world for all is a world where the human rights and well-being of people with mental health challenges are respected, no matter who you are or where you are in life's mental health journey.

In 2015, the General Synod of the UCC passed a resolution affirming a covenant to become Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged (WISE) for mental health, AND in 2022 our Illinois South Conference at the annual meeting unanimously reaffirmed the same covenant. We can strive to be:

WELCOMING and practice hospitality, recognizing patterns that promote stigma and the silencing of people with mental health challenges.

INVITING and encourage all people to participate in the work of the congregation, regardless of any mental health challenges.

SUPPORTIVE to lay members and clergy who have mental health challenges and those who love them.

ENGAGING with other organizations as Hoyleton Youth and Family Services, UCC Mental Health Network, UCC Disabilities Ministries, and the UCC Council for Health and Human Services Ministries. We would follow the Holy Spirit as it leads us to create spaces where people living with mental health challenges

- can feel that they belong,
- can be seen as people first,
- can sense the holy worth of their lives,
- can receive the love of God that is extended to all without partiality, and
- can have their voices affirmed as they offer their sacred gifts.
