MISSION MOMENT

Sue Williams and I plan to attend the General Synod #35, July 11 through 15, in Kansas City, MO.

Our *Illinois South Conference* will be sending 15 delegates. Seven are ministers from various congregations. The other 8 are lay people from our conference. I have their names in case anyone is interested.

During the General Synod, delegates will be voting on 3 *Prudential Resolutions* and 5 *Resolutions of Witness*. Two of the *Prudential Resolutions* have to do with joining in "full Communion" with certain Christian churches in Germany and Puerto Rico. The third *Prudential Resolution* is from "The Small Town and Rural Coalition" of the UCC, and they wish to be recognized as a formal group. From what I can tell, these resolutions are probably not controversial.

The Resolutions of Witness can bring on a lot of interesting discussion and maybe different opinions. These resolutions must pass with 2/3rds of all delegates being in favor.

Even if resolutions pass, they are simply "expressions of Christian conviction concerning moral, ethical, and religious matters, and they are merely a way for the General Synod #35 to be a Christian witness to the world on that issue. But most important: the General Synod only speaks to congregations but never for congregations. It can be said that the resolutions passed at the General Synod might urge, invite, encourage congregations to also witness to these resolves, but General Synod never requires congregations to do so.

From a UCC webinar, as one of the speakers explained, there are different **settings** of the UCC, and **they** speak for **themselves**. Each **congregation** is a setting, General Synod #35 is a setting, our Illinois South Conference is a setting, and the Advocacy Branch of the UCC is another setting. And each setting speaks **for itself**. Each member of our congregation can speak for themself. We are in covenant to **listen** to one another from different settings.

The Advocacy Branch of the UCC in the Washington DC office, relies entirely on the resolutions of witness approved by Synods to determine what to advocate for. When we as individuals, receive action alerts to suggest we contact our congress people, these alerts are based upon past General Synod resolutions. Again, we are not required to act, we are in covenant to listen and pray and pray for guidance from the Holy Spirit. May the Holy Spirit guide us in all we do, and may the Holy Spirit fill and guide the hearts of our delegates as they attend the gathering. From Judy Schmitt
