Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I hope you all had an inspiring. After all, it's not every day that our Savior is raised from the dead. It's as if God is giving us a second chance. (Tongue in cheek.)

Coming up the next few weeks our Gospel lesson will come from the Gospel of John. John writes differently than all the other Gospel writers, Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Let's take a look at why I say John is "different." (All this information came from the introduction to the Gospel of John as written in the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible.)

"It has long been recognized that the Gospel According to John differs significantly from the other Gospels. It has characters and events that the other three do not mention, and it lacks stories that are prominent in them. It uses language rich in symbolism and subtle shades of meaning such as irony and paradox.

Of all the New Testament Gospels, John presents by far the most hostile picture of relations between Jesus and the Jews. It is important to remember that when John speaks of "the Jews," it does not refer to the Jewish people as a whole. It seems the ultimate referent seems to be the synagogue authorities of a particular time and place who were inimical to the Christian movement. John states in chapter 20 verse 31 his reason for writing this Gospel. That purpose was to encourage its readers to believe that Jesus is the Messiah and the Son of God. At one time it was believed that Joh the son of Zebedee wrote this Gospel. Second century tradition places the date in the last decade of the first century or in the first decades of

the second century. In other words, if Jesus died around 35 AD, John wrote either at 90 AD or 100 AD – quite a gap and a doubtful eye witness.

I look forward to sharing more with you as we explore the Gospel of John. Pastor Rosemary
