Dear Sisters and Brothers in Faith,

"The Lord passed before him, and proclaimed, 'The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness.'" –Exodus 34:6 (NRSV)

This morning, I received a text from a friend that simply said, "I am SO ANGRY!" While I needed more context, considering all that he is facing in life and the turmoil swirling around us in this country and the world, his words resonated deeply.

Anger.

We can see it in the grimaces and clenched jaws of strangers passing by us.

We can read it in social media posts filled with outrage.

We can hear it in the rising tone of tense conversations at coffee shops and the fever-pitched reporting of every news channel.

We can feel it in the surge of raw energy around us and in the dysregulated nervous systems of our bodies.

We can notice it in ourselves—in how quick-tempered and negative-focused we've become.

Anger.

It can exhaust us or energize us.

It can build slowly, or it arises fast and furiously.

It can overwhelm us, or we can transform into something redemptive and lifechanging.

But too often these days, anger is not a fleeting emotion; it becomes a wild, unyielding wrath.

Anger arises when we face a loss, when we grieve what was and what may never be again, when we feel we lack control over what is happening around us, when we have been dismissed or disregarded, and when fear and uncertainty tighten their grip.

In Exodus 34:5-6, we read of how God described God's true nature as one who is "merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness." Imagine if we modeled our response to life, to people, to injustice after God's own nature.

Yes, anger can be a justified response. But if we don't slow down and examine it, it can control us--instead of us using it for positive change.

So, dear friend, may we — as people created in God's image—pause for a collective breath. Take a deep breath in...and out.

Then breathe again:

Inhale God's steadfast love and faithfulness.

Exhale the losses, fears, and uncertainty pressing on your spirit.

And when we are still—when our minds, bodies, and spirits are settled—may we seek the Spirit's guidance to respond with mercy, grace, and steadfast love in our thoughts, actions, and decisions as we strive to create a just and loving world for all of God's people.

Gracious God,

May we remember that You call us to be slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

Help us to breathe Your love deeply today—

to release our fears, our frustrations, and our need for control.

Fill us with Your peace,

a peace that passes all understanding.

Let our lives reflect Your heart-merciful, gracious, faithful, and just.

Teach us how to channel our anger into holy action

that builds us instead of tearing us down.

In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.


