Dear Brothers and Sisters of Faith,

I'd like to share with you a letter sent out recently by our UCC President, Rev. Karen Georgia A. Thompson, reminded all of us that the kingdom we strive for is the kingdom (or kin-dom) of God. To worship anything else would be to worship false gods.

"Cherished members of our churches in the Americas and the Caribbean, we send you greetings of peace and hope from Hannover. Scripture reminds us that trusting in weapons and violence is a form of idolatry, calling us instead to place our faith in the Lord (Psalm 20:7). In these times of turmoil and unrest, we are invited to turn away from doctrines of power and might and to abandon reliance on violence, choosing instead to trust in God's steadfast love.

"The recent invasion of Venezuela by the United States, a clear violation of international law, has sown fear and turmoil not only in Venezuela but across the entire region. We are deeply concerned that similar actions may threaten Colombia, Mexico, and even Greenland, as we observe what seems to be a reconfiguration of the Monroe Doctrine and a rise of neocolonialism and fascism. Our hearts are grieving as we witness and acknowledge the distress which has manifested this early in the calendar year.

"Even as the United States leadership exhibits external aggression towards other countries, we are also grieved by the ways in which residents and citizens of the US are experiencing life under this administration. The escalation of raids by ICE, the recent killing of Rene Nicole Good in Minneapolis, shootings in Portland, and other acts of harm and violence perpetuated by ICE are appalling.

"We are witnessing churches and clergy responding in protest and by supporting those who are being disenfranchised by this militarization of US cities. In our world today, the shadow of militarization grows ever larger—whether it's the bombing of alleged ISIS camps in Nigeria,

naval conflicts in the Caribbean, or internal militarization within nations. Echoes of violence ring around the globe: the bombings in Yemen, conflicts between India and Pakistan, and the ongoing crises in West Asia extending beyond Israel and Palestine to Lebanon and Syria.


**“Let us renew our calling to walk in communion and justice, remembering that although we are divided by nationality and ethnicity, our deepest allegiance is to the king-dom of God, and to loving our neighbors as ourselves. We are one family—members of one body—called to serve with loyalty not to any nation, but to the Lord and to one another. In the face of rising militarization, we invite you to pray earnestly for one another, to support each other with compassion, and to discover the joy that comes from our shared life in Christ's one church. May we find strength in our unity and hope in God's everlasting grace.**

We lift before you all places marked by conflict and oppression, and all who resist violence with courage and compassion. Unite us as one body in Christ, loyal not to any nation, but to your **king-dom** of justice and peace. By your Spirit, make us faithful witnesses to hope, steadfast in love, and bold in seeking peace. In the name of Jesus Christ, our peace, Amen.
